1. Definition match. Draw a line between the word and its definition.

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| barter | a sale to get rid of old items and make room for new |
| budget | noun—place where things are sold; verb—visit stores in search of items to buy |
| buy | a plan for spending money |
| clearance | the amount of money asked for an item of value |
| market | a place to buy things, i.e. a grocery store, a bookstore |
| price | to give one thing to get another thing without using money |
| purchase | a place where people gather to buy and sell things |
| sale | work; to swap one thing for another |
| shop | to get something with money; purchase |
| spend | noun—act of buying; verb—to get a thing by paying money |
| store | selling of something; goods selling at lower prices |
| trade | to pay out money in exchange for goods; to use up money |
