## Life's Dream Achieved

When she was a little girl, she scribbled happily with her crayons and started a lifelong passion with art. Today Pamela Czarniak is the proud illustrator of a children's book titled "The Snickerdoodle Mystery". It is a moment she has worked toward for many years. After completing high school, she studied art at Daemen College in Buffalo, New York. She was inspired by painters like van Gogh and Chagall, but also by renowned book illustrators like Jan Brett and David Catrow among others.

Book illustration is a specialized field. Many factors make book illustration different from fine art prints intended to hang on a wall. Pamela says, "It's different in that you have to create the same characters in different situations. It's also challenging to get continuity throughout the book."

"Book illustrators must create art which can be reproduced clearly in a book. The artist must consider the gutter space created by the book's spine which makes it difficult to line up two sections of a picture. Book size and layout are also important factors, but the most important thing is to create art which enhances the story." agrees Celia Webb, President of Pilinut Press, the publisher who selected Pamela to illustrate their latest book. "The number of words a child knows when they enter school is the most reliable indicator of how successful a child will be in school. Our books for 3- to 6-year-olds contain advanced vocabulary to help children pick up more words. But to appeal to children, the story line must be fun and the illustrations have to engage them."

She certainly succeeded. "The Snickerdoodle Mystery" is getting rave reviews by its readers like the one reader Jack Floret posted to Amazon.com: "I have had a life-long fondness for Snickerdoodles (as many other people do as well) and this story is fun for both young and old(er). But the illustrations really make the book an absolute delight. I was surprised to learn that this is Ms. Czarniak's first book. She has a very unique talent, creating pictures that are both whimsical and warm, and that make the story really come to life."

When asked if she would do it again, Pamela said, "I would love to illustrate many more books, it's fun and fulfilling!"
